

Terry Deno opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m.

He announced there will be an Ad Hoc Committee Meeting held on January 15, 2019 at 1:30 PM to review the Comp Plan Amendment Proposal seeking the change of land use from Single Family Residential to General Commercial . The 25 acre parcel is located just next to the old landfill gate on N Indian Trail Rd. Harlan Douglas has requested a zone change to enable building Mini Storage Units on the property.

A hand vote was taken by the attendees. The vote was unanimous to reject the Proposal.

Terry encouraged everyone to e-mail comments to the committee stating their opposition to this request. Comments will be accepted until 8:00 AM January 15, 2019.

Currently the NITNC has no website. The old one expired the end of December. Measures are underway to start up a new one.

Jeanine McKinney reported a balance of \$7,260.48 in the account.

Mark Davies presented Mike Husted with the Annual Good Neighbor Award. This is in recognition of the amount of work he has done to keep the neighborhood informed by sending out the NITNC e-mails.

Traffic Calming applications are due to Neighborhood Services by March 13th.

Neighborhood Services is accepting applications for the Mobile Speed Units now on line. Mark would recommend one be placed on Barnes Rd. above Farmdale to document excessing speeds residents are reporting.

Applications for the Neighborhood Clean-Up Program are due by March 22, 2019.

Mel Neil announced that the Annual Garage Sale is scheduled to be held on June 22 from 8AM-4PM.

Doug Strohsal said that crime reports are down in our neighborhood. He encouraged everyone to please report all crimes.

He encouraged everyone to vote to approve Prop 1 on February 12. It is a ballot measure that will retain 30 trained Firefighters and will add 20 additional police officers for the City of Spokane.

Katie Myers from the Office of Neighborhood Services spoke about the Traffic Calming Program. This program began in 2010 and is funded through the Photo Red Light Camera tickets. The purpose is to improve safety, especially for pedestrians and bicyclists, and to improve the environment of the streets for residents and visitors. Safety for school age children is one of the main concerns.
