The Community Assemble Spring Retreat will be Tuesday April 30th at the West Central Community Center from 6:30 PM - 8:30 PM. The topic of the retreat will be using the Building Stronger Neighborhoods toolkit.

Spokane area's first ramp meter became operational today April 9th. The meter is designed to alleviate backups and collisions on US 195 at the onramp of eastbound I-90. Currently, drivers traveling north on US 195 cannot easily merge onto I-90 eastbound which creates backups on both US 195 and eastbound I-90. The ramp meter will regulate the flow of traffic entering I-90 and decrease congestion in the right lane of eastbound I-90

Terry said that the Indian Trail Road grind and overlay will start Monday 4-15-2019. It should continue until July.

Jamie from State Farm said they will once again host 3 petting farms this year. One will be the day of the neighborhood yard sale and will run from 10 - 2. They are also working on some other projects.

Starbucks new manager Kyle Gigstead brought coffee and some Starbucks cups to the meeting. He wants Starbucks to become involved in community activities and urged people to come see him with their ideas.

Our treasurer Jeanine McKinney reported a balance of \$7129.72. 2018 books were audited by Chris Savage and Nancy Perkins. See her statement below.

Our police resource officer Keith Cline reported 8 calls in the neighborhood including:

- 2 domestic calls
- 2 vehicle prowlings
- 1 stolen vehicle recovery

He reminded everyone to not leave their garage door open, lock, and don't leave valuables visible in parked cars. Keith was asked about the person living in a tent on the hillside. Not much info other than if it is on private property the owner must remove the items. If on public land, police must give 48 hour notice before clearing the area.

Karen Stratton reported that if you are having trouble getting a quick response for code enforcement problems, you can call direct to her or Candice's office for help. They will try to assist in contacting law enforcement. There have been discussions about using surplus city land to build low income cottage housing. That housing is intended to be close to services and not in our area. Karen is now doing POD casts. You can find more info on City Council website.
