

Terry Deno opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m. He reported 25 tons of waste were collected on the Spring Curbside Pickup day in April. Because of the high volume collected, there will not be a Fall Curbside Pickup this year. Terry has applied for Dump Passes to be available in October.

The Election of Officers for the NITNC was held. By a unanimous vote all 4 current officers were re-elected to serve another 2 year term. Terry Deno-Chairman, Mel Neil-Vice-chair, Jeanine McKinney-Treasurer, Kathy Husted-Secretary.

A reminder about the Yard Sale was made. The date is June 22 from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. More than 50 homes are participating.

Jeanine McKinney gave the Treasurer report. The current balance in the account is \$7,260.48. A copy of the Financial Report is always available on the NITNC website.

Mark Davies gave his Community Assembly report: The Shadle Area Planning Studio will be held June 11th thru the 13th. This is a cooperative effort between the neighborhood councils and the City of Spokane to help shape a community vision for the Shadle district center. We are embarking on a series of input opportunities and public engagement studios designed to shape, refine, and review the vision for the future of the area. The first Studio is June 11th 6pm to 8pm at Glover Middle School on Longfellow Ave, and June 13th at the Shadle Library 6pm to 8pm. They are looking at walkability, safety, access to public services, community amenities and neighborhood development.

The June 7th ONS Friday Update contains summer concert schedules for several neighborhoods and how to obtain the Spokane Youth Card for your children to participate in many summer activities.

June is secure load month. The Spokane Solid Waste Disposal Department will be emphasizing that and beginning to charge a fee for uncovered loads at the Waste to Energy facility.

A summer event titled Riverfront Eats will happen every Tuesday June thru August 11am-2pm at the Orange Bridge in Riverfront Park to include food trucks, live music, and a few surprises along the way. A portion of proceeds will benefit free and low-cost programming in Riverfront Park.

Major Eric Olson, SPD, gave a presentation on the Use of Force Policy that is being modified by the Spokane Police Dept. They will be making changes to the training policy to better handle cases that call for Use of Force. They are also working on increasing the number of Certified Mental Health Officers to assist in evaluating the calls when they are needed. They received a Grant and will partner with Frontier Behavior Health.

Janet Robel spoke about the Summer Concerts in the Park sponsored by Prince of Peace Church in partnership with the NITNC. The first concert is June 30. The final one is July 31. Dr. Katherine Hakes (Integrated Dental Arts) was welcomed as a new sponsor.

A representative from the Park Planning Dept. gave some information regarding the future development of Meadow Glen Park. Grants are being applied for. This Fall they will be working on developing a Parks and Open Space Master Plan for the city. They will determine what the needs are for Park Facilities in our area.

Barbara Brock spoke on the Homeless situation in Spokane. She brought 2 men that she has been working with who are homeless. They spoke to our group about some of the problems they have encountered being homeless.

There was also a presentation given to educate the public as to what items are appropriate for the Recycle bins and what are not acceptable.

This was the last meeting for the summer. Terry closed the meeting at 8:55 p.m.
