Jeanine McKinney gave the Treasurer's Report. \$163.39 was spent to renew our Zoom account with the city. We were reimbursed for that amount by the city. The current balance remains at \$7,014.94.

Officer Keith Cler announced that he will be covering 2 area neighborhoods now. The Traffic Unit has been put on hold temporarily. It will be moved to patrol. They hope to have it back in force at the first of the year.

Annica Eagle reported that there will be Traffic Calming Workshops set for later this year.

Terry Deno gave an update from the Community Assembly.

Applications for changes to the Comprehensive Plan can be submitted up until Nov. 1st.

On Sept. 1<sup>st</sup> there will be a combined CA/City Council joint meeting.

Spokane Parks Foundation.org is taking applications for Grants for improvements to Parks.

The meeting ended and was followed by a Presentation led by Nicholas Hamad on the plans for developing MeadowGlen Park. It was a very interesting and informative discussion about the goals and the types of amenities the neighborhood would like to have available there.

There will be Community Workshops offered in the future for more discussion and ideas. A sign that reads "Future Home of MeadowGlen Park" will be installed on the property this Fall. The start time for construction will be 2-3years out.
