Traffic Calming Projects are planned for some crosswalks in our area along with adding a sidewalk on the North side of Shawnee between Indian Trail and Moore.

Jeanine McKinney reported that we received a donation recently to our account which brings the balance up to \$7,029.94. The request for the Community Engagement Grant was submitted and accepted. The total amount was \$850. \$163.40 was used to renew our Zoom Account. The remainder will be used to sponsor a band for our Summer Concert Series this summer on July 13<sup>th</sup>.

Terry Deno gave a brief up-date from the Community Assembly.

Zack Zappone reported from the City Council.

The City is continuing to work on trying to provide shelters for the homeless.

The Mayor is creating a Task Force to discuss some ways to address the increase in the number of shootings in Spokane.

He mentioned the EMS Levy that is on the ballot for April 26<sup>th</sup>. It would be a renewal for the years 2023-2028.

The Parks Department is planning to have a sign in place for Meadowglen Park in the next few months.

John Rothlin from Avista gave a presentation on ways to consider lessening the amount of carbon pollution created by our energy systems both gas and electric. They are discussing how to decarbonize the systems and are exploring Renewable Natural Gas options.

Our Neighborhood Resource Office, Tim Schwering said there were not a lot of calls for service in our area last month.
