

Terry Deno opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m.

Jeanine McKinney reported a balance of \$6,476.49 in the account.

Lieutenant Jake Jensen spoke about the Reorganization Plan the Spokane Police Department is implementing to improve and increase service to the various areas of the city. Staffing levels have declined and CFS (Calls for service) have increased over the past year. A total of 50 Officers will be covering the Northwest area. There will be no NRO officers.

Captain Tom Hendron and Officer Jake Jensen will be in charge of our area. They plan to address speeding issues on Indian Trail Road.

Mark Davies gave a short report from the Community Assembly. A Strategic Planning Committee is working on a 2 year plan to help get 7 inactive Neighborhoods set up to hold Neighborhood Council Meetings both in person and on line.

Paul Chapin (Head of Operations for all Spokane Libraries) spoke about the progress on the newly remodeled Indian Trail Library. It plans to open about the middle of March. It will be children and parent and family oriented. There will be meeting spaces, event spaces and 2 study rooms. It will offer Story Time twice a week and Art Classes. It also plans to offer an Electric Charging Station in the parking lot being donated by Avista.

Jennie Anderson attended the meeting. She is excited to see it open. She will be the branch manager.

Zack Zappone gave the City Council update.

He spoke about some revisions to the Landlord Tenant Laws becoming effective Jan. 23,2023.

Homelessness remains a top priority for The City Council. Less than 200 people remain at Camp Hope.

He spoke about the issues with the construction of the North/South Freeway.
