The city has proposed major changes to the Comprehensive Plan that will affect all neighborhoods both in Single Family designations, density of housing and short-term rentals. More information can be found at:

City Council is proposing an ordinance that will make the city parks closed and off limits between 10 pm and 5 am. This will allow law enforcement personnel to stop and question individuals for "trespassing". The hope is that this will reduce the drug gang and transient activities in the parks after dark.

I was nominated by the CA to be one of their representatives to Council President Breean Begg's Neighborhood Action Committee. I look forward to representing both our neighborhood and the Community Assembly.

Karen Stratton gave an update from the City Council.

The Spokane Police Dept. and the Parks Dept. are working together with the City Council to gain more control of crimes happening in the City Parks. They introduced an Ordinance that would make being in the parks after hours a misdemeanor that could warrant arrest.
