

NITNC MEETING MINUTES January 13, 2026 34 attendees

Terry Deno opened the meeting at 6:00 p.m.

He said that the design for Meadowglen Park has been completed. Construction is planned to begin in July or August.

Jeanine McKinney gave the Treasurer's Report.

There was a \$30.00 donation collected from the November meeting. No December activity.

The ending reconciled balance is \$6,018.24

Captain Tom Hendren said our area continues to be a very safe neighborhood.

There have been some changes in officers and times patrolling the streets. There have been some reported issues with speeding at Seminole and Shawnee and at Woodridge and Navaho, where some accidents have occurred.

Dan Knechtel reported from the Community Assembly. It will be sent as a separate email because of its length.

Kitty Klitzke spoke about Plan Spokane 2046 which the City of Spokane is undertaking now. It is a periodic update to the Comprehensive Plan which is the guiding document for future growth and actions by the city. There are 3 choices that could affect our neighborhood. The city would like feedback/comments by Feb. 18th.

Volunteers are needed for the Point-in-Time-Count to count the homeless population.

It is scheduled for Jan. 22-Feb. 3rd.

Last night at the City Council meeting there was a discussion concerning accepting \$1 million dollars in federal funds to hire 8 new police officers for the city. A show of hands was taken, and all attendees were in favor in accepting the funds.

Lee Williams Spoke about the Volunteer Park Program, Friends of the Park. She encouraged people to volunteer to help keep the parks clean by picking up litter on a regular basis, working on the flower gardens, or cleaning up pine needles.

Jamie McIntyre gave a presentation on Fire Risk Reduction.

She spoke about the importance of making sure smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms are equipped with good batteries and placed correctly around the home.

She stressed it is important to buy Listed items with a label (ELT) or (UL). She also spoke about the proper storage and disposal of Lithium batteries. First Alert is a good brand.

Mel Neil mentioned that the Subway in the Sundance Plaza has closed.
